I want to take a minute to thank the Frederick County Board of Elections staff and all the election judges who worked tirelessly to ensure our county voters could vote safely and securely, whether by mail-in ballot or in person. Our thanks extend to canvassing teams for their critical work. Our State and local Boards of Elections are committed to ensuring elections are free, fair, and accurate. We appreciate their dedication and election integrity.

Today, I also want to acknowledge those who were successful in the primary:

a) Angela Alsobrooks, Democratic Nominee for Senate b) April McClain Delaney, Democratic Nominee for Congressional District 6

c) Board of Education: Josh Bokee, Veronica Lowe, Janie Monier, Chad King Wilson, Sr. They, in addition to two Republican extremists were the top six vote-getters and will advance to the general election.

d) Congressional District 6 Biden delegates to the Democratic National Convention: Jessica Fitzwater (Frederick County Executive), Karen Lewis Young (State Senator D3), Tom Slater (DCC member), and three from other counties within the district Donna Edwards, Brian Grim, and Djawa Hall.

Our work will be cut out for us between now and the election on Tuesday, 5 November. We need to collectively do all we can to ensure that Joe Biden wins the White House, that Angela Alsobrooks defeats Larry Hogan for the US Senate seat, that April Delaney defeats Neil Parrot in Congressional District 6, and that we secure all three Board of Education seats because only the top three vote-getters in the general election will win seats on the Board of Education. UNITY, GRATUTUITOUS SELF-PROMOTION, REAL LEADERSHIP, and PASSINGS

The voters have spoken and both parties now have selected their teams for the general election. Mari Lee, Shelly Beaird-Francois, Sue Hecht, Myrna Whitworth, Jessica Fitzwater, Victoria Venable, and I attended a Unity Breakfast on May 23 sponsored by the Maryland Democratic Party. We are a unified party! The Governor, both of our U.S. Senators, most of our congressional delegation, the Comptroller, the Lt.-Governor, the Speaker of the House, the Senate President, and hundreds of loyal Democrats were in attendance. Many of the candidates who did not win were there including Joe Vogel, Leslie Lopez, Laurie-Anne Sayles, and Joel Rubin from the 6th congressional district. But the biggest unifier was Congressman David Trone, who gave a heartfelt and enthusiastic endorsement of Angela Alsobrooks. Alsobrooks ended the morning with a speech from the heart which shows how she relates to the average voter and why she is such a superstar candidate.

In contrast, Alsobrooks' opponent, the former governor and gratuitous selfpromoter, was exposed in a recent Baltimore Sun editorial, which pointed out the "partisan hubris and misrepresentation that the candidate claims to detest." Hogan, in a social media post, said that as governor in 2022 his administration "opened the new Nice-Middleton Bridge - which is similar in size - across the Potomac, under budget and ahead of schedule" and added that he "had been urging the Biden administration to expedite" any environmental review of the new Key Bridge and promised to "cut the red tape" if elected to the Senate. The Sun notes that the Key Bridge replacement already has qualified for an expedited permit review under the National Environmental Policy's "categorical exclusion list" and therefore there is no red tape for Hogan to expedite if he is elected to the Senate.

The Sun also points out that the Nice-Middleton Bridge, which Hogan takes credit for, was already designed and ready to go when Hogan took office in 2015 and was actually held up by Hogan when he vetoed legislation to help finance it. He then got into a dispute with Democratic lawmakers as to whether the bridge should have a bike lane that had been promised that the Hogan administration cut from the project because of cost. The Sun editorial goes on to point out that "as a better comparison of how Hogan would handle transportation construction as a U.S. Senator, we might look to the Purple Line light rail project he initiated during his first term. By the time he left office last year, the project was 66% over budget and nearly 5 years behind schedule." We cannot elect to the U.S. Senate such a gratuitous self-promoter.

A real-time comparison to the selfpromoting Hogan is the rapid response that the Biden administration has provided to the Francis Scott Bridge collapse. A unified command structure for the rebuilding of the bridge was immediately established by Biden's administration including \$60 million in federal Emergency Relief funds.

The harbor has already been reopened so that vital commerce can again come to Baltimore and the State of Maryland. The Biden Small Business Administration provided low-interest disaster loans to eligible businesses, and the Department of Labor approved the first tranche of Dislocated Worker Grant funding to support workers impacted by the bridge collapse. President Biden has requested congressional authorization to fully cover the cost of rebuilding the bridge. Baltimore County Executive Johnny Olszewski said, "Biden demonstrated a clear understanding of the importance of the port, had a real empathy for myself and all the individuals impacted ... and he was unequivocal that he was going to do whatever he can, legally and within his power to expedite a response." Biden is a leader, not a bloviating selfpromoter.

Recent passings of note included Peter Angelos, Larry Levitan, Doyle Nieman, Carolyn Krysiak, and Ina Taylor.

After a long illness, Peter Angelos died at age 94. We all know Angelos as the longtime owner of the Baltimore Orioles, but he was also a major player in the Maryland Democratic Party. He served one term on the Baltimore City Council and was defeated in the Democratic primary for Mayor of Baltimore. He was a major contributor to the Democratic Party and Democratic candidates. In 1997 I was attending a Democratic fundraiser in Baltimore and approached Angelos because I wanted tickets to see the Orioles play in Cleveland in the new sold-out Jacobs Field. Angelos put me in touch with his brother-in-law, and I was able to purchase great box seats for the Orioles-Indians series.

Larry Levitan, a powerful member of the Maryland Senate from Montgomery County, was chair of the Senate Budget and Taxation Committee for 16 years. He was defeated for re-election in 1994 by Republican Jean Roesser and afterward was a lobbyist in Annapolis. He and Bob Kresslein, for a time, were partners in a large law firm. Larry was 90.

Doyle Nieman was described as a classic case of a 1960s student radical who embraced community service and electoral politics to achieve his ideals. A writer and lawyer, he served on the Mt. Ranier City Council, Prince George's Board of Education, and the Maryland House of Delegates. Doyle was an acquaintance of mine; we served on some committees together and I always admired him for his inclusivity and commitment to Democratic ideals. He was 77 and died from complications from surgery.

Carolyn J. Krysiak was an East Baltimore original. She was a housewife and mother who, after her husband served many years in the Maryland House of Delegates and was appointed chair of the Maryland Workers Compensation Commission, ran for the House of Delegates. She served in the House of Delegates from 1991 until 2011. She was outspoken in her support for the people of East Baltimore. Barbara Mikulski, guoted in the Baltimore Sun, said "She was ahead of her time. She was a reformer. She saw a new day coming. She was also the eyes and ears of her neighborhood. She was equally at home in Annapolis as she was at a neighborhood bull roast." I didn't know Delegate Krysiak, but I wish I had known her. She was 84.

Ina Taylor died this month at age 90. She had a passion for Democratic politics and owned and operated a needlecraft shop in Bel Air and lived in Cecil County. She was the perfect example of a campaign volunteer, starting with Senator Paul Sarbanes' first campaign for the U.S. Senate. She staffed headquarters, canvassed neighborhoods, put up yard signs, staffed booths at the fair, and worked the polls on election day. She attended and staffed four Democratic conventions. In 2007 she was the first recipient of the Maryland Democratic Party's Democrat of the Year award. She was a good friend and her engaging smile and willingness to do the work of the Party will be greatly missed.
