Eleven days ago, President Biden sent shockwaves through the country and world when he announced he would not seek reelection. August is a very busy month for the DCC. In addition to the volunteer orientation, we'll be present at a few community events. This Saturday, 3 August, we'll be at our usual spot for First Saturday, from 2:00-5:00pm: in front of Middletown Valley Bank, 9 N. Market Street. We'll also have a tent at National Night Out on Tuesday, 6 August, and the Black Frederick Festival on Saturday, 24 August on Carroll Creek. We hope you'll stop by our table at any or all of these events to say hello, pick up campaign and/or Party literature, sign up to volunteer, or all the above! "The Rest of the Story"
ECONOMICS: Talking Points and the Impending Crisis That Few Want to Talk About

Economics is a subject that I do not profess to know much about, so I rely on experts to guide my thinking. First the good news. Heather Long, a columnist and editorial writer for the Washington Post whose focus is on the economy, recently pointed out some facts that should be good talking points for Democrats in the upcoming campaign:

"It's true that, in many ways, the U.S. economy looks great right now. Growth is solid. Inflation has come way down. The stock market is at a record high. Unemployment is a mere 4.1 percent. The economy added more than 200,000 jobs last month, and more people are looking for jobs now than a year ago. Plus, most workers are seeing their paychecks grow more than inflation. Summer vacation travel is also booming, one of the clearest signs households are doing pretty well." Washington Post, July 12, 2024.

Democratic candidates at the local, state, and national level need to pound these points home to counter the false narrative that the economy under President Biden is not doing as well as it was under President Trump. Just one example of changes that could be enacted to make the economic situation better was outlined by Mary Makary, a professor at the Johns Hopkins School of Medicine. She advocates switching to a site-neutral payment for operations under Medicare that would not differentiate between whether the procedure occurred at a hospital site or a nonhospital site. According to Dr. Makary:

"Reform would also save a lot of money. In 2021, the Committee for a Responsible Federal Budget calculated that if Medicare began paying for all services in a siteneutral way, the program would save \$153 billion over the next decade. This would go a long way toward addressing the imminent insolvency of the Medicare trust fund." Washington Post, July 12, 2024.

Here is another potential Democratic talking point: Let's start looking for ways to make Medicare more efficient and provide for long-term solvency.

But there is a crisis that few Democrats or Republicans want to address. Some

Republicans talk a good game about the federal deficit but fail to acknowledge that the debt has increased far more under Republican federal leadership than under Democrats. Other than during the time that the United States fought two major world wars in the 20th century, the federal debt increased by percentage more under 5 Republican presidents: Reagan 160.8%, George W. Bush 72.6%, George H.W. Bush 43.3%, Richard Nixon 34.3%, and Donald Trump 33.1%. Unfortunately, the debt increased by 64.5% under President Obama. The increase under Biden has been only 8.8%. Biden's Inflation Reduction Act could actually reduce the deficit by \$58 billion over the next decade (source: Hiranmayi Srinivasan, writing in Investopedia, July 1, 2024). The current federal deficit is spiking to \$2 trillion. According to an editorial last year in the Washington Post:

> "That's double last year's deficit. The deficit has been this high and surged this fast only during global crises such as World War II or the COVID-19 pandemic...The big problem is rising interest costs. The U.S. government must pay more to borrow money now than it has in recent years. ... Tax receipts are coming in lower than expected despite strong corporate profits and low employment...This can't go unchecked. Federal debt is on track to hit a record level by 2029, meaning it will be higher as a percentage of the U.S. economy than even World War II's peaks. And it will only get uglier from there if politicians continue to ignore it." Washington Post, September 10, 2023.

Traditionally the Republican Party has led the way on fiscal responsibility. But Ronald Reagan's tax-cutting policies for the rich and MAGA economics have strayed from traditional Republican principles.

"No more taxes," candidate Larry
Hogan's mantra, will result in a
continuation of the Trump-era tax cuts
for the very wealthy who do not pay
their fair share. Megan McCardle, also
writing in the Washington Post 3 with
an emphasis on economics, places the
blame where it should be:

"The treasury lost about \$1.5 trillion to the George W. Bush tax cuts during his term, \$2.1 trillion by the most generous estimate of the cost of the wars in Iraq and Afghanistan (plus another \$465 billion to care for veterans of those wars), and roughly \$2 trillion to the Tax Cuts and Jobs Act, a.k.a. The Trump tax cuts." McCardle says the biggest problem of all is "politicians who keep trying to pretend our troubles away, rather than face up to what needs to be done." Washington Post, December 7, 2023.

Former Democratic U.S. Senator Bob Kerry, again writing in the Washington Post, calls the national debt crisis "not the elephant in the room. It is the herd of elephants in the room, accompanied by braying donkeys" pointing out that "interest payments this year also will exceed the total spent on veterans, education, and transportation combined." He dismisses the nostrum that the national debt will be erased by economic growth and calls for the president and Congress to do their patriotic duty and lead on this issue. Washington Post, June 26, 2024.

It is clear to me that the Republicans have abdicated their leadership on issues related to the economy, but it is up to Democrats to face this issue in the future, particularly in addition to the growing federal debt but also the looming underfunding of Social Security and Medicare. Only Democrats can be trusted to tackle this issue fairly and by applying Democratic values to the needed solutions.


