There is an all-out assault on our country, and it's coming directly from inside the highest office in the land. The president and his administration are brazenly staging a coup. Not in the dark of night, but in the open, and Republican federal officials are complicit through their votes and their silence. Under the guise of an unofficial government department claiming to make the government more efficient and to eliminate wasteful spending, federal jobs are being slashed, and agencies and much-needed research and services are being disrupted or dismantled on a whim.

These actions have caused immediate harm, devastation, and uncertainty for the many direct employees of the federal government, and anyone who receives federal funding to do their work. Furthermore, the proposed plan to cut Medicaid and SNAP would create its own harm, devastation, and uncertainty. It's hard to fathom the longer-term, far-reaching, harmful consequences on our health, national

security, and economy. It will take all of our collective voices to speak against these and other worrying actions that seek to further slide us toward authoritarianism and fascism.

This weekend, the Democratic Central Committee is hosting a Weekend of Action at our local HQ at 8 West 5th Street, Frederick. Join fellow Democrats for postcard writing parties led by local Democratic volunteer and activist Melanie Galloway. Volunteers will write postcards to help elect Judge Susan Crawford, Democratic candidate for the Wisconsin State Supreme Court. This is a critical election to keep the Democratic majority on the court and protect voting, civil, and women's rights, and so much more. There are two shifts on Sunday: 10 AM - Noon & Noon - 2 PM. Space is limited. Learn more and sign up for one or more shifts here. You will receive a short training session at the start of each shift. We'll address any questions or concerns, ensuring you feel prepared and confident to help with this effort.

Our local HQ is also a collection site for a community diaper drive. A local group, Dems Help, will distribute the diapers to designated community organizations. You may drop off anytime between 10 AM - 4 PM tomorrow. Monetary donations are not accepted, and neither Dems Help nor the Central Committee can provide a tax-deductible receipt.

Next Saturday, March 8th, the DCC and local group Rise Up Frederick are cohosting a Resistance Protest and March from Noon to 2 PM in response to the administration's overreach and power grab. You can learn more about

this event on our flyer on page 7. The planning of this event is very fluid. Please be patient as we continue to plan and confirm speakers and details. We will do our best to provide updated information as timely as possible.

A few weeks ago, we hosted a town hall/listening session at the C. Burr Artz Library. We had over 100 people attend, and about 30 shared their thoughts on national issues and on the upcoming Frederick City election.

One of the immediate actions we implemented from the listening session was creating a "Resist Fascism" page on our website that provides links to resources for impacted federal workers and links to sites and/or documents detailing how to contact your elected officials and options to get involved. We will continue to add new information as we discover it. Please email us at info@frederickdemocrats.org if you have links to sites or resources we should consider adding.

The Frederick City Council approved its new election district boundaries at a recent meeting. You can view the new map and learn more about the 2025 City of Frederick's municipal elections here. The Central Committee plans to host a campaign school on Saturday, April 5th, from 10 AM – 2 PM for anyone interested in running in the City election. We also welcome anyone who may want to run in the 2026 election cycle. We will provide more details soon.



KEN MARTIN ELECTED AS NEW DNC CHAIR; STARTS "ORGANIZING EVERYWHERE TOUR

I recently attended the Winter Meeting of the Democratic National Committee at National Harbor in Prince George's County. The main event was the election of a new Chair, several Vice-Chairs, and other officers of the Democratic Party, to serve until the next quadrennial national convention in 2028.

Those seeking to serve lobbied members hard over the first two (2) days of the meeting At the outset, the frontrunners appeared to be current Vice Chair and Minnesota Democratic Farm Labor Party Chair Ken Martin and Ben Wikler, Wisconsin Chair, with our own former governor, Martin O'Malley putting in a major effort. Each team had outstanding WHIP operations. While candidates also lined up for support for a second ballot as several ballots were predicted, at the end of the day, Ken Martin easily prevailed on the first ballot.

The balloting for Secretary, Treasurer and Finance Chair went along smoothly with incumbents Jason Rae, Virginia McGregor and Chris Korge being reelected on the first ballot. The same could not be said for the balloting for the Vice Chairs which lasted over seven (7) hours. The successful candidates included Reyna Walters Morgan as Vice Chair for Civic Engagement and Voter Participation and Vice Chairs at-large, Artie Blanco, Malcoln Kenyatta, and David Hogg.

It was especially gratifying to see the election of David Hogg, Parkland survivor David Hogg and co-founder of March For Our Lives and Leaders We Deserve. dedicated to recruiting, training, and funding young progressives running for Congress and State Legislatures,

I and most of the Maryland delegation supported Governor O'Malley. who gave the best and most rousing of the chair nominating addresses, but it was not meant to be But for the Governor's bid, we would have unanimously supported Ken Martin.

I have heard some grumbling that Chair Martin has yet to take the lead in opposing President Trump's power grab but be assured he is working hard to organize for opposition and electoral success. He has only been chair for a couple of weeks!!

Ken's first initiative is his Organizing Everywhere" tour, traveling to blue, purple, and red states across the country to underscore his commitment that Democrats will go everywhere,

compete everywhere, and win at every level of the ballot. As the initial part of the Tour, he has visited Pennsylvania, Texas, Illinois, Missouri, and Wisconsin in his first two weeks. His goal is to get out of Washington and talk to working people. In McKeesport Pennsylvania, Martin said 'Our party can't just be a party focused on seven battleground states and a few Congressional seats, The way we win back working people is making sure that we're competing and contesting every single race up and down the ballot."

You can act right now to hold the Trump-Musk administration accountable:

- Attend town halls to let your elected officials know how Donald Trump's reckless agenda has impacted your community and your life.
- Make calls, knock on doors, and vote in off-year elections like in the City of Frederick, Thurmont, Emmitsburg and New Market
